# SCE JOB SEARCH SUPPLEMENT DATASET CODEBOOK

#### **MAY 2023**

Note: As of 2023, we are posting a newly formatted data file, replacing the ones we had posted previously. Please note that some of the variable names may have changed. Going forward, we will be updating and adding new data to this file.

#### **SUMMARY**

This document lists the survey details as well as survey questions and their possible responses for the Survey of Consumer Expectations (SCE) Job Search Supplement.

#### Job Search Supplement Overview

The Federal Reserve Bank of New York has fielded the Job Search Supplement each October since 2013. The sample frame is the same as that for the monthly SCE, and is described in detail by Armentier et al. (2017). In short, it is a nationally-representative sample of heads of households age 18 and older. The Job Search Supplement draws a cross-section of these respondents to interview online each October. As such, the annual supplement is a series of repeated cross-sections rather than longitudinal. The Job Search Supplement was originally designed by Jason Faberman, Andreas Mueller, Aysegul Sahin, and Giorgio Topa, and Faberman et al. (2017) provide additional details on it. Each survey year has roughly 1,100 observations, with the specific number for each year listed below.

#### Micro Data and Codebook Details

Within the public Job Search Supplement dataset, variables are named based on their survey question number, which corresponds to the question number listed in this Codebook. Next to each question, the Codebook also lists the skip logic that defines the scope of respondents who are asked the question.

Some questions allow the respondent to "check all that apply." These questions have a separate variable (roughly named after the response option) equal to one if the respondent checked the option and zero otherwise. These questions are tagged with a "[CA]" label in the Codebook.

Some questions allowed respondents to provide an open-ended "Other" response. Prior to the public release of the micro data, these open-ended responses are recoded into one of the other possible responses to best extent possible. In the micro data, variables that include recoded information have an "\_rc" suffix. Recoded variables also have an imputation flag variable (labeled using the question number and the "\_impute\_flag" suffix) associated with them, which is equal to one if a respondent have had any answer recoded. In the Codebook, these questions are noted with an "[RC]" label.

Questions have been added or revised since the inception of the survey in 2013, with the majority of these changes occurring between the 2013 and 2014 surveys (there were no changes to the survey in 2018 or 2019). The Codebook

notes these changes with note in brackets that briefly describe the change. In some cases, the survey added new options for question responses or revised existing responses. In these cases, the revision is also noted next to the relevant response.

One notable change was the revision of how the survey asked about labor force status after 2013. In 2013, the survey asked a single question about employment or nonemployment status (Question L1). From 2014 forward, the survey first asks about employment status (Question L1a), and then asks about the type of nonemployment (revised Question L1) if the respondent does not respond that they are employed in Question L1a.

Another notable change was the removal of the option to report earnings as monthly or biweekly after the 2013 survey. Consequently, the 2013 biweekly and monthly responses were imputed to a weekly estimate based on reported usual hours worked for consistency with data from other survey years.

Finally, in 2020 several survey questions were added and the responses to several survey questions were revised to elicit responses that may have been specific to the Covid pandemic, or to address potential measurement concerns that arose in other household surveys during this time. These are noted in the same manner as revisions from earlier years.
