



NMHC Rent Payment Tracker Finds 90 Percent of Apartment Households Paid Rent as of August 20



The National Multifamily Housing Council (NMHC)'s Rent Payment Tracker found 90 percent of apartment households made a full or partial rent payment by August 20 in its survey of 11.4 million units of professionally managed apartment units across the country.







Downward Mobility

"When the moratorium started, we started getting families that had never reached the ALICE {Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed} threshold before. They had no record of receiving financial support. Now, they were one paycheck away from homelessness."


•Out of 575 applications for assistance filed since April 10th, 460 were first-time assistance requests.

Children experiencing homelessness are 8-9X more likely to repeat grades.




Education Deficits from School Closures

- Students studying from home are faced with isolation, anxiety, and uncertainty about the future.
- Students may have a hard time concentrating and manifest symptoms of depression in the months to come.
- Students are likely to enter school with more variability in their academic skills.

On Future Housing

"If you have just one eviction on your record, they won't rent to you. And it's not illegal."

On Mental Health and Family Stability

"When you're evicted, you lose your place to be in the world. A trauma like this stays with a family for the rest of their lives."

"When survival is your mission every day, you can't address the trauma you are experiencing. A lot of healing needs to be done."

Spending on Interventions

 "For \$200 per child, we can keep a family housed, compared to \$4000 to rehouse them."

 April 2018 study in Tacoma, WA showed \$1,668 cost per successfully diverted family, vs \$10,641 cost per family housed in emergency shelter.
