Election of Directors

(By member banks classified in Group 3 on November 4, 2002, that is, member banks with capital and surplus of less than \$30 million on that date)

To the Member Banks of the Second Federal Reserve District:

In accordance with section 4 of the Federal Reserve Act, as amended, and Circular No. 11471, dated November 4, 2002, on the nomination of directors of this Bank for terms of office ending December 31, 2005, to succeed George W. Hamlin, IV, class A director, and Ann M. Fudge, class B director, whose terms expire December 31, 2002, there are shown on the following pages the names of the candidates nominated for such offices, and by whom nominated.

To each member bank classified in Group 3 on November 4, 2002, the following are being sent with this circular:

- (a) Ballot for use in voting for a class A and a class B director.
- (b) Pink ballot envelope in which the ballot is to be sealed.
- (c) Certificate envelope bearing on its face the certificate in regard to the vote.
- (d) Addressed envelope in which all of the foregoing should be returned to this Bank.

The ballot and the certificate on the certificate envelope must be executed by an officer who has been authorized to cast the vote. A list of the officers designated for this purpose by the member banks in Group 3 was contained in the above-mentioned circular dated November 4, 2002; the list is also contained herein. In order that the ballots may be secret, the name of the bank and the name and title of the voting officer should not be written on the ballot, but should be written only on the certificate envelope.

- (1) The ballot should be marked.
- (2) The marked ballot should be placed in the pink ballot envelope and that envelope sealed.
- (3) Then the sealed pink ballot envelope should be placed within the certificate envelope, and the certificate envelope should be sealed and the certificate thereon executed.
- (4) Then the certificate envelope containing the sealed pink ballot envelope should be returned to this Bank in the enclosed addressed envelope.

The law provides that the ballot shall be cast within 15 days after receipt of the list of candidates transmitted herewith. The polls will open at 10 a.m., December 9, 2002, and will close at 12 noon on Tuesday, December 24, 2002, and in order to be counted as valid the ballot must be received at or before the latter time. Upon the closing of the polls the ballot box will be opened, the votes counted and checked by tellers, and the results of the election announced. The candidates may, if they so desire, be present or represented on this occasion.

Because banks in Groups 1 and 2 will not vote in this election, this circular is sent to them without forms and for their information only.

CHARLES V. WAIT was born May 28, 1951 and is a graduate of Cornell University. Mr. Wait began his banking career with The Adirondack Trust Company in 1974. In 1982 he was elected as a Director, 1984 as President and in 1989 as Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer.

In the past, Mr. Wait has held positions on the Board of Skidmore College, Empire State College Foundation and the Adirondack Chapter of the American Red Cross.

He is past chairman of the Greater Saratoga Chamber of Commerce, the Saratoga Performing Arts Center, the New York Bankers Association and the Saratoga Springs City Center convention facility.

Mr. Wait currently serves as a Trustee of the New York Business Development Corporation, Saratoga County YMCA, the New York Racing Association (NYRA) as well as being Treasurer of the New York State Bankers Association, Chairman of the New Century Fund and Secretary-Treasurer of the Yaddo Corporation.

His awards include the Commitment to Community Award from the New York State Business Council, Outstanding New Yorker from the New York State Jaycees, a Private Sector Initiative Award from President Ronald Reagan, the Capital District Business Review Executive of the Year in 1999, and an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from SUNY Empire State College in 2001.

Maurice P. During '22 Professor in Demographic Studies
Professor of Sociology and Public Affairs
Princeton University
Princeton, New Jersey

MARTA TIENDA is Maurice P. During '22 Professor in Demographic Studies, Professor of Sociology and Public Affairs at Princeton University, where she directed the Office of Population Research from 1998–2002. Formerly she held appointments at the University of Chicago (1987–1997), where she served as Chair of Sociology (1994–1997), the University of Wisconsin (1976–1987), and Stanford University (as visiting professor). She received an honorary doctorate in social sciences from The Ohio State University (2002).

Dr. Tienda is President of the Population Association of America, a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the recipient of various academic honors and fellowships, including: AAUW's Outstanding Young Scholar Award (1984–1985); the Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Study and Conference Center (1997); Stanford's Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences (1990–1991); the Sackler Institute of Advanced Studies (Tel Aviv, Israel, 1993–1994); the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation (1993–1994); and a Ford Foundation Doctoral Fellowship (1972–1977).

Dr. Tienda served as trustee for several philanthropic organizations, including the Kaiser Family Foundation, and the Russell Sage Foundation, and currently serves as a Trustee for the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the W.T. Grant Foundation, and the Jacobs Foundation of Switzerland. She is also a member of the Board of Economists of Hispanic Business Magazine.

Professor Tienda received her B.A. in 1972 in Spanish Literature from Michigan State University (Honors College). She holds a M.A. (1975) and a Ph.D. (1977) degree in sociology from the University of Texas at Austin, with a specialization in social demography and stratification.
