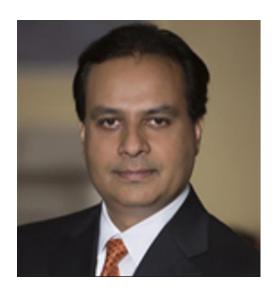

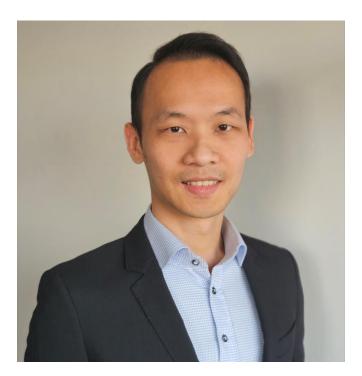
Per von Zelowitz
