Binghamton is located in the Southern Tier region of New York State near the Pennsylvania border, and the metropolitan area is home to almost 250,000 people. Though manufacturing remains a key sector for the region, Binghamton lost 70 percent of its manufacturing base since 1990-one of the largest declines for any metropolitan area in the nation. As manufacturing has waned and the economy has restructured, the education and health and leisure and hospitality sectors have become increasingly important. Binghamton University has become the region's economic centerpiece and has helped stabilize an otherwise struggling area.





#### **Annual Employment Change by Metro Area**





#### **Unemployment Rate by Metro Area**









## **Unemployment Rate**




#### **Manufacturing Employment**




