The New Brunswick metro area in New Jersey, located south and southwest of New York City, has a population of almost 1.9 million people. The metro area includes places such as New Brunswick, Edison, Woodbridge, Somerville, Perth Amboy, Long, Branch, and Asbury Park, as well as the Jersey Shore, helping to make leisure and hospitality important to the local economy. The area also encompasses a number of higher educational institutions, notably Rutgers and Monmouth universities, as well as a plethora of pharmaceutical companies and the medical facilities of RWJBarnabas Health and Hackensack Meridean Health, contributing to strong employment growth in the health care sector. Warehousing has also been a strong contributor to economic growth. The New Brunswick metro offers numerous transit options into New York City and as a result, home prices have grown strongly, particularly in Monmouth County. Incomes and educational attainment are higher than for the nation, and slightly higher than for New Jersey as a whole.







Annual Employment Change by Metro Area





Unemployment Rate by Metro Area









Labor Force




Unemployment Rate






Manufacturing Employment




Professional & Business Services Employment
