Located in the northern part of New York State near the St. Lawrence River, Watertown is one of New York's smallest metropolitan areas, with a population of 117,000. The area has seen little population or employment growth in recent decades. Watertown is home to the Fort Drum military reservation, with significant local economic activity centered around serving the facility. As in many other upstate New York metropolitan areas, the manufacturing sector has shed a substantial number of jobs in recent decades. Growth in the health and education and professional and business-services sectors have helped offset some of these losses.





Annual Employment Change by Metro Area











Unemployment Rate




Manufacturing Employment
